WOODBURY PARKS COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES June 18, 2019

Commissioners present:

The following issues were discussed:

1. Rez Building
Ribbon Cutting Ceremony and Art Show wet well. Interest from more artists for future shows anticipated. Sound boards to be installed for better acoustics. Highway Department graded lot in time for ribbon cutting and paving to be done within next 2 weeks.
Beautification Committee provided and installed landscaping.
2. Welcome Back Party
Attendance was 400+. A few guests thought the band played too loud but did not inform park staff during event.
3. Camp Rez
Currently 60 campers for first session. Fully staffed. 12 campers interested in Teen Camp.
4. Seasonal Employees
Fully staffed
5. Pickle Ball
Clinics were very well attended and may stripe additional courts. Interests in dividing groups based upon experience. Successful program thus far.
6. John P. Burke Memorial Pool
Joey Gianzero reported that it seems there are multiple leaks in the pool (now 10 years old) that are still not resolved. The Town has scheduled a pool engineer to assess issues and make recommendations.
Commissioners will be informed of results.
7. Request from Resident to allow foreign nephew to attend Camp Rez
The Commissioners had previously discussed this request and suggested the Town Attorney provide guidance. The guidance was conveyed through Commissioner Ungerer that the decision was up to the

Commissioners. As requested by the Commissioners, a statement of guardianship was provided by the Resident but some Commissioner felt it was not complete or official. The issue was debated and the concern that Camp Rez is for full-time Woodbury Residents only a main concern. A vote was taken and the decision made not to allow the request for these reasons.

8. Electric Scooters / Bikes

Recent incidents have occurred and riders and parents informed they are not permitted, per the rules and regulations (Page 2 #9). Security will be reminded to enforce the regulation for safety of park users.

9. Old Business

Disk Golf - A recent article in THR about a successful program in Middletown. Issue at Rez is impact to trees if expanded into wooded area. It was noted that field area is used during Camp Rez for frisbee activities.

10. New Business

To date, residents have informed the park office if 6 golden trout caught at the Rez. Pizza coupons will be distributed per program intent.

Commissioner Porcu noted that stop sign existing park (on Coach Wilson Trail at Schunnemunk Road) needs to be relocated. It was noted that it was recently re-posted after being impacted.
